Evergreen Public Schools serves a 54-square mile district in Vancouver, Washington. Union High School is the fourth high school built in the district.

The 48-acre Union High School Campus has five different buildings that represent the four different academic fields of study and the Student Commons. The five campus buildings are: The Leadership and Business Building; The Engineering and Environmental Sciences Building; International Studies and Athletics Building; The Visual and Performing Arts Building; and the Student Union Building.



The campus also includes a Track/Athletic field, Varsity and J.V. Baseball fields, Tennis Courts and Soccer Fields.

HDJ provided civil engineering and traffic engineering services, including grading and erosion control, storm drainage, sanitary sewer, fire and potable water utility extensions. HDJ designed the roadway and frontage improvements along Friberg-Strunk Road, which included road widening, utility extension and sidewalks.

Stormwater quality was achieved utilizing rain gardens. These facilities are low impact, effective stormwater pollutant filtration and infiltration facilities that are aesthetically pleasing green space.
